The Lessons

FIRST READING: Acts 8:26-40

The people sit.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

An angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?" He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this:

 "Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter,
 and like a lamb silent before its shearer,
 so he does not open his mouth.

In his humiliation justice was denied him.

 Who can describe his generation?

For his life is taken away from the earth.”

The eunuch asked Philip, “About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?” Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, “Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?” He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

A Reading from the First letter of John.

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us.

By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and do testify that the Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world. God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us.

God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God

abides in them. Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. We love because he first loved us. Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also.

Partial-Occupancy Services at 8:30 and 10:30 am, beginning Sunday,

Recently, we've seen virus rates drop below the diocesan guideline that allows for in-person worship on Sundays:

As a reminder, the 7-day average needs to remain below 20, but we are in the orange on it for now, which is very heartening news. We are going to offer the following initial plan for returning to worship.

Safety Practices

Masks, Social Distancing, and seating by family bubble will continue to be required, even for those who are vaccinated. Vaccination is strongly encouraged for all members; please ask Fr Ben if you have questions about the church's practices or the moral questions around vaccines. Please be aware that at present, we are using an outdoor port-a-potty as our bathroom facility while our indoor facilities are being re-done. We believe many people will want to wait until they are vaccinated or until later this year to return, but if we have strong enthusiasm, we may ask people to alternate weeks in attending to keep our numbers to a safer margin.

We will have 2 in-person worship opportunities on Sundays. This timing should allow our ministers to be fully vaccinated by our return, and allow time for our audio/visual streaming technology to be fully installed in the sanctuary, eliminating some trip hazards and clutter.

8:30 am: a service of up to **40 people** plus ministers (advance sign-up required). Praise Band music. This service will NOT be broadcast via Facebook Live.

9:30 am: a prep and cleaning time; we will be asking people to depart from the sanctuary after the previous service.

10:30 am: a service of up to **40 people** plus ministers (advance sign-up required). Organ music. This service will be broadcast via Facebook live.

This schedule keeps our cleaning needs to a minimum, and also allows us to use this remaining construction time to experiment with a two-service Sunday, which might give us the opportunity for a true Formation Hour between the two services, which could be used for everything from coffee-hour fellowship across our times to parish meetings and events to ongoing classes. This seems like an appropriate moment to try this possible schedule out.

Holy Communion

We will begin celebrating weekly Eucharistic services again, rather than Morning Prayer. These will involve only the hosts (bread) and not, at present, a common cup. I will reiterate a call for people who would like to receive communion at home, and if needed, train Lay Eucharistic Ministers to make those visits. We will continue to have safety practices around preparing communion.

Acolytes, Lectors, Altar Guild

We will be evaluating our liturgical ministries one by one, but at present are not restoring them fully. The hope is to begin carefully adapting and returning these elements of our worship as we think through issues of care, safety, and the ministry of each, so stay tuned and please check in with Kate and Fr Ben about your ministry in the coming weeks!

Singing

At present, we don't have enough clarity about how best to safely add singing back into our indoor worship services. We will continue to review best practices, medical advice, and technology possibilities, and hope to add choral music back in at some point to both services. While it won't immediately be a part of our programming, we will continue to actively work towards it.

Communications

While our hope is that transmission rates continue to decline and vaccines make everyone safer, a sudden surge in transmission or cases or other medical realities may require us to return to virtual worship in the future. If we do, we will attempt to make that call by the preceding Thursday so that the news can be shared via the weekly e-mail (sign up by contacting Jay Hammond at parish@sainta.net), as well as on our website and Facebook page.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Update for 4-22-21

Our project is continuing strong!

This past week has seen most of the interior insulation put into the framing walls, and drywall has begun going up. We're beginning to see the interior room shapes emerge. A major technical component was completed: our power was switched over to the new electrical closets and the old panel (which was in the middle of our main hallway) was removed, showing the new, wider hallway, which will allow us much easier "traffic flow" from our sanctuary to the parish hall.

Our exterior work includes putting the new septic "leech field" in (a set of pipes and materials), and staking and grading for the new parking lot area, which will be expanded to the north side of our space. We should see a concrete pour soon. We also have some new plumbing staked to get water service out near Morgan Hall's new location and the rain garden feature. The rain garden is a code-required part of our site, and helps create a space for drainage and natural water runoff. It will also have some planting to it, so having water near there will allow us to more easily maintain this new part of our garden.

We are also using this opportunity to replace some paneling and siding that was damaged by water over time, and we will be having a concrete subcontractor look at a slight buckling in our front walkway – these are repairs that we can do efficiently right now with our contractors on site and oriented to our spaces, and represent good stewardship over time. In general, we aren't adding to the cost of the build by doing this, but are using other funds that are already directed towards such repairs, so this is simply good stewardship of an efficient opportunity.

Finally:

I tend to be cautious about announcing firm numbers, because in construction they tend to shift. However, our contracting partner has done well by us and we currently are showing some real contingency funds remaining, as well as

an on-schedule projection of receiving our certificate of occupancy by the beginning of August. There remain some variables to the build, and the CO (certificate of occupancy) inspection will depend in part on the city, but these are strong signs that MCL is working hard to keep us on track and within budget, and it's a credit to their experience and the early work they did planning expenses. We are also aware that we took our "leap of faith" at a very opportune time, as lumber prices have gone up very significantly this year, and our costs were locked in by our contract last year. We have much to be grateful for with our build.
